

Pre Departure Travel Information – Haines, Alaska

Welcome to your upcoming trip with Alaska Mountain Guides. The following information is included to help you with trip planning and travel arrangements. Please forward along your travel itinerary as soon as possible so we can make the appropriate pick-up/drop-off arrangements.

By Air:

The easiest way to get to Haines is from Juneau, the state capital. Alaska Airlines has daily flights from Seattle with flight time being about 1.5 hours. You will want to arrange your flights to Juneau. From Juneau, a 35-minute local commuter flight will bring you to Haines. Alaska Seaplanes have multiple flights per day. We can also arrange for a scenic chartered flight if you would like to see more of the Lynn Canal or beyond on your way to Haines.

By Water:

Another option for travel between Juneau and Haines is the Alaska Marine Highway System. Sailings are about 4 hours and are frequent, but less regular than flights. Further information can be found online at the Alaska Marine Highway website - <u>http://www.dot.state.ak.us/amhs/</u>

By Road:

For those looking to combine their trip with us as part of a larger vacation, driving the Alaska Highway offers the experience of a lifetime. Haines is connected to the Alaskan Highway at Haines Junction (approx. 160 miles from Haines). All sections of the highway are paved and there are several campgrounds and lodges along the way. Guests coming from the south should plan at least 5-7 days of travel from the lower 48 to make it to Haines (approx. 2,000 miles from Seattle).

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For Alaskan residents travelling south from Anchorage / Fairbanks area the driving distances are as follows:

Anchorage – 754 miles (approx. 14 – 15 hours of driving) Fairbanks – 640 miles (approx. 12 hours of driving)

We recommend travelers from the north budget a minimum of 2 days for the drive -- more for winter/spring road conditions.

Pre-Trip Meeting:

We ask that you arrive the evening before your trip is scheduled to start, for a pre-trip meeting with your guide(s). If you are unable to schedule your travel to arrive the day prior to your trip or face unexpected delays while travelling, please contact us and we will be happy to make other arrangements.

The pre-trip meeting is generally scheduled at 6:00pm (unless otherwise noted) the night before your trip starts. Please bring your gear as we will go over equipment, the itinerary and answer any pre-trip questions you may have. The office is located at 371 Sawmill Road. Our office is open from 8:00am to 5:00pm, Sept. – May and 7:00am – 7:00pm May - Sept.

The next morning, we will meet as scheduled by your guide at the pre-trip meeting to begin our trip. You should plan on eating breakfast before the meeting. Extra luggage that you do not need in the field can be stored at a secure location at our warehouse for the duration of your trip.
